

Pupil Premium - How it works in Integris


Pupil Premium categories:

- 1. Deprivation Pupil Premium (based on Entitlement to Free School Meals (FSM))
- 2. Service Children (one or more parents are Category 1 personnel serving in the Military)
- 3. **Post Looked After** pupil adopted from Local Authority care
- 4. Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) based on deprivation for nursery year pupils only (not Reception pupils)
- 5. Looked After Children in Local Authority care

1. Deprivation Pupil Premium (based on Entitlement to Free School Meals (FSM))

There are two data items that reflect FSM Entitlement and Deprivation Pupil Premium – both of which are located in the **Student Details > Entitlement screen**.

The FSM Entitlement Start field will contain a start date to indicate a child currently eligible for FSM and an FSM Entitlement End date field, which, if populated indicates when the eligibility had ended. When the FSM entitlement is still active, the pupil record is flagged with on the Status bar of the pupil record.





Each October Census newly 'eligible for FSM' pupils since the last October census are captured in the following October Census and added to the existing PP pupils to form the basis for funding in the next financial year.

The Pupil Premium Grant (categorised as Deprivation PP for FSM eligibility) box is automatically populated with information supplied by the DfE via a DfE PP Download file **imported into Integris**. The Deprivation Pupil Premium entry is updated with funding information and this automatically flags the pupil record's

Status bar with a flag for any pupil newly added to the FSM Register (i.e. with a start date that falls in-between the October Census dates). The PP download file lags behind the start of the funding for the current financial year (i.e. 1st April).

The Status Bar of the pupil record will display the Entitled to FSM providing there is no FSM end date and the PP flag will continue to display if PP Grant entries appear in the Pupil Premium grant box.

You can have up to 4 situations representing Pupil Premium (PP) and FSM eligible children in your Integris:

1. PP Pupils who are not currently Eligible for FSM - these are pupils with the PP flag PP only These pupils will have had a period(s) of FSM eligibility in the past and the school is funded for these pupils. A DfE download file imported into Integris will have 'switched on' the PP flag and populated funding details in the Pupil Premium Grant box (Entitlement screen) for each financial year since these pupils first became entitled to FSM. These pupils are included in your current financial year's funding for PP and will continue to be included for funding allocations in future years even though they may not be currently eligible for FSM.

To search for PP Only pupils: In the *General Search* screen > Additional Info tab > *Entitled to FSM* = **False** and **DPP - Deprivation Pupil Premium** Applies **Any Year** (note: if selecting Any Pupil Premium, this will include Post Looked After and Service Children Pupil Premium if you have any)



2. PP pupils who **are currently** Eligible for FSM – these are pupils with the PP flag AND FSM flag

These pupils are still eligible for FSM and the start date for eligibility will be a date on or before the last October census. A DfE download file imported into

Integris will have 'switched on' the PP flag and populated funding details in the **Pupil Premium Grant** box for these pupils. These pupils are included in your current financial year's funding for PP and will continue to be included for funding allocations in future years.

To search for PP and FSM pupils: In the *General Search* screen > Additional Info tab > *Entitled to FSM* = **True** and **DPP - Deprivation Pupil Premium** Applies **Any Year**

3. Pupils who are currently Eligible for FSM – these are pupils with the FSM — flag only

These pupils are eligible for FSM and the start date for eligibility will be a date after the last October census reference date. These pupils are not 'officially' PP pupils as your school will not have received PP funding for them. These pupils will be captured in the next October census and will be included in the following year's funding allocation for PP. These pupils will be flagged PP after the DfE download file is imported into Integris in the following June/July.

To search for Entitled to FSM Only pupils: In the *General Search* screen > Additional Info tab > *Entitled to FSM* = **True** and **DPP - Deprivation Pupil Premium** *Does Not Apply* **Any Year**

4. New pupils to your school that were or currently are entitled to FSM (on CTF import, they have a FSM start and/or end date(s)). If the FSM Start date without

an end date is present, the FSM flag will display on the status bar.

If the entry date to your schools falls BEFORE the October Census date for the current academic year, then the FSM details of your new pupil will be captured in the October census and the PP funding should be received in the following financial year (and the pupil details included in the PP Download file). The pupil record will show the FSM Flag until the PP Download file is imported into Integris and the PP flag will then show on the status bar.

If the entry date to your school falls AFTER the October Census date for the current academic year, then the FSM details of your new pupil will be captured in the NEXT October census of the following academic year. The PP funding will not be received until the start of the financial year within that academic year. The pupil record will only show the FSM Flag until the PP Download file is imported into Integris and the PP flag will then show on the status bar.

Using the School-defined Pupil Premium flag – as any of the above four situations may apply, it is much easier for schools to use the School-defined PP indicator to flag ALL of the pupils who are effectively Pupil Premium through deprivation to enable to capture them all when searching for these pupils (see School Defined Pupil Premium overleaf).



Finding out information about FSM and Pupil Premium in Integris

You can use **Find** in Speed Edit (with Area set to FSM Entitlement Start) or **Find** from the **General > Student Details** screen.

1. Find ALL the pupils who are currently eligible for FSM

In the General Search screen > Additional Info tab > Entitled to FSM = True

This will give you ALL the pupils who are currently eligible for FSM - some of which are also PP pupils (you are funded for) and some are flagged as FSM only

Those that are flagged with FSM only - if their FSM Entitlement Start Date is on or before the last October census date, then the school receives funding for these pupils for the current financial year. These pupils will be flagged PP after the DfE Download file is imported.

2. Find ALL the FSM (or past FSM) pupils that you are currently funded for

In the General Search screen > Additional Info tab > DPP - Deprivation Pupil Premium Applies Any Year to obtain a list of (and total for) PP pupils

3. Find ALL the pupils who are currently eligible for FSM since the last October Census to determine additional PP funding for current/next financial year

In the *General Search* screen > *Additional Info* tab > *Entitled to FSM* = True AND for *Pupil Premium Grant* select DPP - Deprivation Pupil Premium *Does*Not Apply Any Year

These pupils will be either be funded this financial year if their FSM start date (or entry date for new pupils if FSM) is before the last October census date (and next PP Download file will populate PP Grant information to confirm) OR

Will be funded in the following financial year is FSM Start date (or entry date) is AFTER the last October Census date.

If you perform this search in the **Administration > Speed Edit** screen, choosing **FSM Entitlement Start** under **Area**, you will be able to click **Value** to sort the FSM Entitlement dates to the more recent first. Pupils with a start date of <u>before or on</u> last October Census date will be included in your current financial year's PP funding allocation.



2. Service Children

General > Student Details > Additional tab

The 'Service Child Indicator' field is where you identify a pupil whose parent(s) serve in the military. By ticking this indicator box, the field shows Yes.

A second additional field **Service Child Indicator Source'** can also be used to confirm that this information was provided by the parent.

This situation may change and the field should be updated to No (by unticking the indicator box) if one or both parents leave military service.

Note: The PP Download file will INCLUDE Service Children pupils if they have been identified in Integris and last submitted through the October census. The Pupil Premium Grant entry will display 'SCP – Service Child Premium'.

3. Post Looked After

This field only applies when 1. A child has been adopted following a period of looked after care where the Local Authority has acted as the 'Corporate parent' (i.e. pupil has been in LA care) AND 2. the adoptive parents have chosen to notify the school of their own accord.

The DfE notifies adoptive parents of the situation regarding additional Pupil Premium funding for their child should they wish to take this up with the school. Schools should NOT seek or contact parents for this information.

General > Student Details > Additional tab

The **Post Looked After Arrangements** field is where you select the type of looked after arrangement in place based on the information supplied to you by the adoptive parent(s).

Note: The PP Download file will INCLUDE Post Looked After pupils if they have been identified in Integris and last submitted through the October census. The Pupil Premium Grant entry will display 'AFC – Adopted from Care Premium'.

4. Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP)


This premium only applies to children in Nursery years (does not include Reception Year pupils).

The LA informs schools of pupils who are eligible and will also inform the schools as to the reasons for the EYPP eligibility.



General > Student Details > Additional tab

The In receipt of EYPP indicator field needs to be ticked to show 'Yes' and a EYPP Basis for Funding field needs to identify the reason for the funding.



Note: The EYPP eligibility does not carry forward into Reception year as an Entitled to FSM indicator.

Parents, if still eligible when their child moves into Year R, must re-apply for FSM.


It is useful for schools to be aware of who their EYPP pupils are in order to alert parents to re-apply if they are still eligible.

Important Note: EYPP Pupil Premium is NOT included in the PP Download file.

5. Looked After Children (LAC)

General > Student Details > Additional tab

These are pupils who are looked after under the auspices of the Local Authority. Schools are directly informed about these children and can identify them in Integris by ticking the box for *In Care while at current school* and if required, additional information can be added into the *Care Details* box. Additional details can be added if relevant – whether a *Care Order* is in place, the *Care Authority* in charge of the care, whether another authority is in charge of the care and if an *Education Supervision Order* is in place.



Important Note: Pupil Premium grant is held by the Local Authority and not generally passed down to schools. The PP Download file will **NOT** include any details of Post Looked After pupils.



School-Defined Pupil Premium

This field can be used by the school to identify all the Pupil Premium pupils in school regardless of grant type and whether the school is in receipt of funding or not (based on the time lag between census, financial year start date and the data imported via the DfE's PP Download file).

You can also mark pupils in receipt of EYPP funding if relevant for your school.

The **School Defined Pupil Premium** indicator box can be ticked to switch on the indicator.



When using FIND to search for PP pupils, simply use this field (located on the Additional Info tab) to search for ALL of the PP pupils you have marked as PP.
